Highlights of 2024-2025

The past three years have been defined by significant growth at National Kidney Foundation of Wisconsin. Our growing volunteer base, active community engagement, and the investment of generous community partners have enabled us to grow our presence and impact in Wisconsin.

Below is a snapshot of how NKFV has grown in the past fiscal year. Please note that fiscal year 2025 ran from July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025.

Building Connections

Kidney disease can be isolating for those who have it as well as their care partners and medical professionals. By bringing our kidney and transplant community together, NKFV creates opportunities for connection and empowers all our kidney warriors through education.

- Living Donors Together Support Group membership grew by 14%
- Added 5 more patient/community education events to total 17
- Professional education events included 41% more attendees in FY25
- 108 volunteers gave of their time and talents to bring this mission to life

Building Awareness

More than 35 million Americans are estimated to have chronic kidney disease (CKD), however as many as 9 in 10 adults with CKD are unaware. Building awareness of this chronic health crisis through informational displays, free kidney health screenings, and storytelling helps individuals to take control of their health.

- 10 kidney health screenings in FY25 reached 110% more participants
- 26 media placements brought visibility to kidney disease and organ donation compared to 16 the year before
- 100 community appearances brought NKFV across Wisconsin FY25
